During the past year and a half, the Mapleton-Fall Creek Neighborhood Association and others led by Isaiah Kuperstein have been pursuing efforts to stabilize and secure the old Beth-El Temple as an Indiana Landmark. As Rabbi Dennis Sasso has said, "Properly restored, it can once again become an asset to a reenergized neighborhood and a testimony to the Jewish historical footprint in Indianapolis."

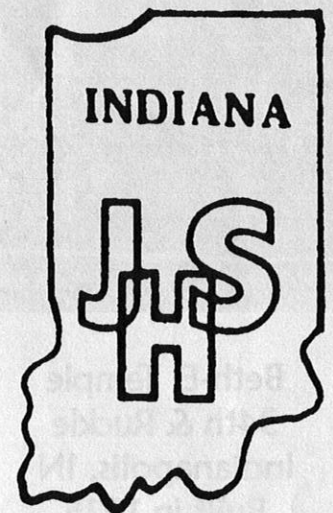
The 2013-2014 executive officers will be elected by the Board before the annual meeting.
